The Newhouse Newsletter is published bi-monthly. With each issue we bring you the voice of a Newhouse resident as she shares her new beginning.

I came to Kansas City running from my ex-husband. I was going to start over—reinvent myself in a brand new place. I expected to stay at Newhouse for a short time—just enough time to get a paycheck and get back on my feet.

As part of my new life, I got a quick physical checkup at the doctor. That's when I found out I had stage three cervical cancer.

Miss Monci [Newhouse Vice President of Shelter Services] called me into her office and asked about my prognosis, friends and family, and what I would do. I told her I have no living family and had only been in Kansas City for eight days.

Miss Monci said, "Well, we will be your family" and just to concentrate on doing what I have to do medically. She said Newhouse would continue to provide shelter and help me get a support system going.

I have good days and bad days, but when I'm really sick with my treatments the staff has gone the extra mile for me again and again. I feel safe and secure here, but more than that, I feel the real affection that the staff have for me and the sincere caring for my wellbeing.

When I beat the cancer and move back into the mainstream, my memories of Newhouse will always be that of thanksgiving.

January Is National Stalking Awareness Month

Did you know...

- 1 in 12 women will be stalked in their lifetime.
- 77% of female victims know their stalker.
- 81% of women stalked by a current or former intimate partner are also physically assaulted by that partner.
- 28% of female victims obtained a protective order. 69% of female victims had the protection order violated.
- 76% of women who were murdered by their intimate partner had also been stalked by the killer.

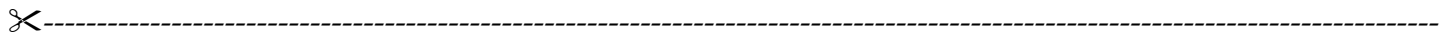

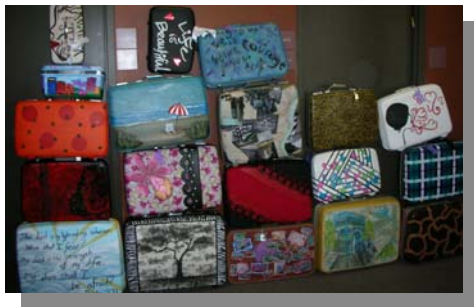
